In today's Gospel, Elisha commanded that a small amount of bread be served to 100 men. Elisha's request is met with doubt and unbelief, but Elisha reminds them, "For thus says the Lord, 'They shall eat and there shall be some left over'." And indeed there was.

Elisha trusted that promise, acted upon it, and saw the promise miraculously fulfilled. We, like most people, tend to forget that God can multiply food like this. If we trust in God and live as good stewards, what we accomplish is, in its own way, a miracle.

The main focus of today's Gospel is Jesus' miracle of feeding the 5,000, but Philip plays an important role in what we are being taught. The Lord speaks specifically to Philip asking: "Where can we buy enough food to eat?" Jesus knew full well what miracle He was about to perform, but He also saw this as a chance to teach His Apostles, and us, too. Philip and the others had already seen Jesus perform many miracles, and there should have been no question in his mind about the divine resources Jesus had at His disposal. Yet, Philip hesitated. It is human nature to hesitate, to perhaps doubt, when it comes to believing and trusting.

Even the Lord's closest followers could not really believe. But through this miracle, Jesus is teaching us to trust Him and to do the same in our lives. And, by committing ourselves to a stewardship way of life, we can see our own gifts multiplied. And perhaps even perform our own modern-day miracles.
